
Welcome to our Information Session

RES has now submitted a Section 36 application for consent to the Scottish Government for a 14-turbine wind farm proposal at Blair Hill, approximately 2.7 km north of Newton Stewart in Dumfries and Galloway.

Today's information session showcases the final design for the wind farm and the application documents that have been submitted to the Scottish Government's Energy Consents Unit (ECU). There are a number of staff on hand who would be happy to talk you through any of the material and answer any questions that you may have.



Final Design and layout

The design of the project was iterative and environmentally led, taking into consideration the on-site environmental and engineering constraints to reduce the potential impacts on the wider landscape and archaeological features.

Throughout the design of the project, RES has been in communication with key consultees and delivered an extensive community consultation programme to obtain feedback which has been input into the design and EIA process.

The final layout consists of a 14-turbine wind farm, featuring 12 turbines with a tip height of 250 metres and 2 turbines with a tip height of 210 metres. Associated infrastructure will include access tracks, substation, construction compound, cabling and borrow pits.
