

¹The homes figure has been calculated by taking the predicted annual electricity generation of the site (based on RES assessments Blair Hill has a predicted capacity factor of 42.8%) and dividing this by the annual average electricity figures from the DESNZ showing that the annual GB average domestic household consumption is 3,239 kWh (January 2024).

²The carbon reduction figure taken from the EIAR using the SEPA Carbon Calculator for Wind Farms.

³The business rates figure has been calculated from the most recent non-domestic rates revaluation in Scotland (2023 Revaluation) and predicted performance of the wind farm.

⁴The inward investment figure and economic activity figure are taken from the Economic and Community Impact Report.
